OHIO VETERANS UNITED ENDORSES GREG ROBINETTE FOR BOWLING GREEN CITY COUNCIL

CINCINNATI – October 20, 2011 – Ohio Veterans United has endorsed Greg Robinette for City Council (4th Ward) Bowling Green, Ohio. The announcement was made by Harry Prestanski, executive director and founding member of Ohio Veterans United. “Following a thorough review of the candidates’ backgrounds, experiences, and positions on issues, we believe that Greg Robinette shares our core values, including being a staunch and effective supporter of veterans,” says Prestanski. “He has shown a dedication to service and commitment to state and community.”

Robinette served honorably as a U.S. Army Officer and is a veteran of 29 years. He enlisted as an Army infantryman in 1982 and after attending Officers Candidate School he was commissioned an officer in 1984. Robinette served with the 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment in West Germany; as company commander with the 101st Airborne in Saudi Arabia and Iraq; with the Joint Intelligence Center Pacific, Hawaii; with the Multi-National Brigade in Kosovo and as commander of the 437th Military Police Battalion. He currently holds the rank of Colonel and commands the 371st Sustainment Brigade of the Ohio National Guard with 2,000 soldiers in his command. Robinette is also a member of American Legion and a life member of the VFW.

Robinette graduated from Purdue University, the University of Toledo College of Law and also the U.S. Army War College. He has served on the Bowling Green Zoning Board of Appeals and the Bowling Green Planning Commission, and he currently serves as the chairman of the Planning Commission.

“Veterans such as Greg Robinette have a tremendous amount to offer in terms of virtuous leadership, integrity, professionalism, and service,” said Prestanski. “Our mission is to educate

citizens on the need to maintain a strong national defense and to help elect qualified veterans and like-minded non-veterans to office.
